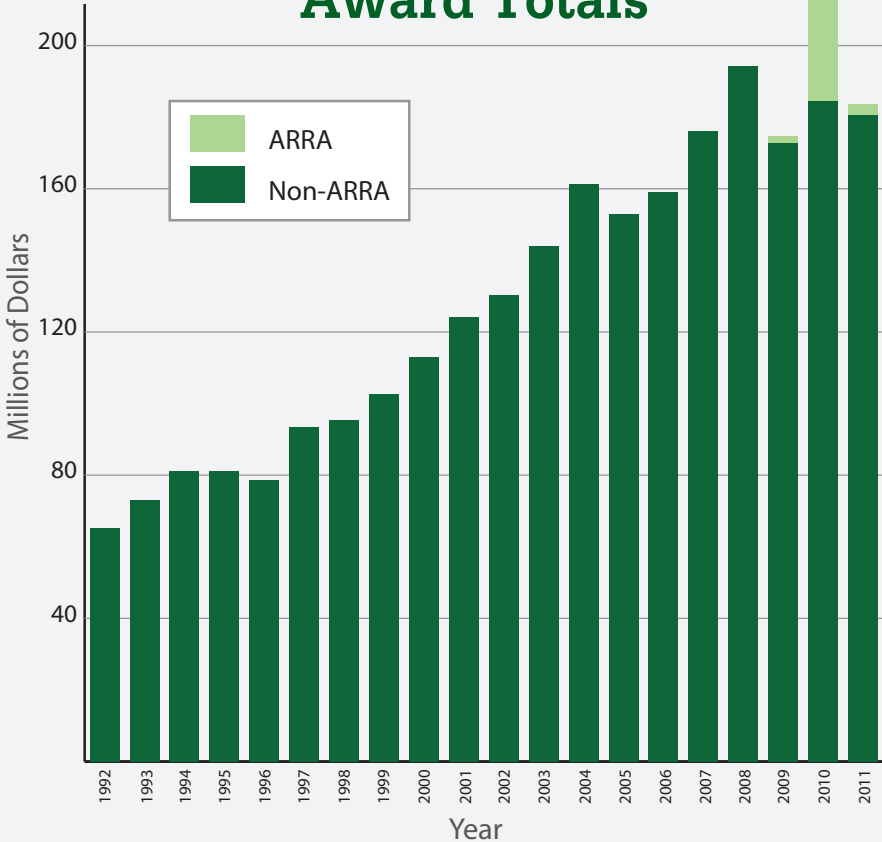

# Sponsored Project Award Totals



The total funding awarded to sponsored projects at UCSB in 2010–11, from July 1 to June 30, was \$184 million, of which \$3 million was funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). These funds provided a one-time funding opportunity through extremely competitive programs run by federal research agencies, most of which were awarded and disbursed in Fiscal Year 2010.

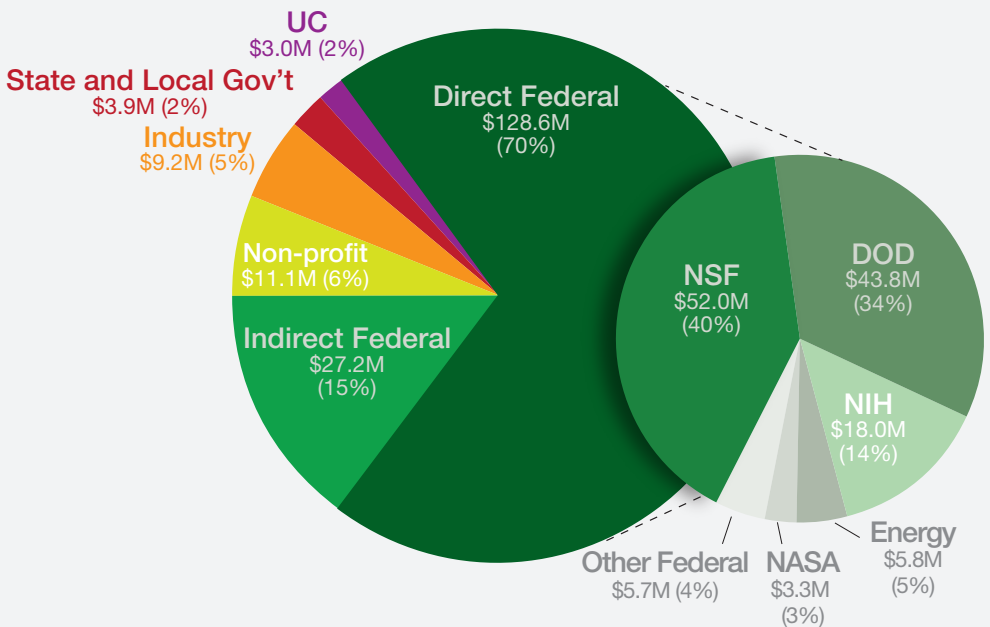

UCSB received \$156 million in direct and indirect federal funding, which represents 85 percent of the total sponsored project awards.

\* Funds in the Indirect Federal category were awarded initially to another institution by the federal government for a multi-institution project, then flowed through for work performed at UCSB.
